Remote Learning, Student Expectations, Grades K-6
Revised, 11/16/2020 -- Level 5 RESET

LEVELS 2, 3, 4 & 5

When students are learning in remote settings, either by choice, during hybrid instruction or because of a pause of in-person school, they will be expected to:

- Follow their daily schedule to attend all of their classes in a virtual environment.
 - Complete any attendance activities or other attendance measures as their official attendance in school. Attendance is expected every day school is in session. Attendance continues to be mandatory and legal even during remote learning.
 - Log in to Canvas each day for school for direct instruction, directions for the activities, feedback from teachers, and work time as directed by their teachers
 - Attend to the classroom instructions via video, written directions, Google Meets, or live feed and then continue to finish lessons, complete practice work, or assignments in a self-directed or teacher-directed fashion.
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- Use their school-issued device for learning, not their phones.
 - Engage, complete work, study, prepare homework, read assignments in texts and online, engage with their teachers and classmates and, essentially, use their time as they would in a typical in-person environment.
 - Grades will be taken on assigned work, activities, projects, and tests as designated by teachers.
 - Follow teacher-provided due dates for assignments, projects, papers, homework, and other classwork. Due dates are based on pacing of the curriculum and classroom expectations.
 - Submit assignments on the due date **(unless alternative arrangements have been made with the teacher or per a child's IEP, ILP, 504, etc.)**
 - Be accountable for all assignments. Grades will be taken as the teacher directs, and students' work quality will be important whether in-person or remote.
 - Turn in assignments via Canvas as directed by their teachers.
 - *(*Kindergarten and 1st grade students may need time and experience before submitting assignments through Canvas.)*
 - Read daily.
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- Be ready for instruction daily with a charged iPad or computer, headphones as needed, school supplies, and materials.
 - Be dressed appropriately for school and follow the online expectations and procedures provided by the teacher and/or school.
 - Be consistently respectful to the teacher and to other students.
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- Communicate regularly and respectfully with teachers and classmates via the virtual platform whether in Google meetings, online discussions, or other teacher-directed means.
 - Sign up for help with teachers (during established office hours) as they are available if extra help is needed.
 - Communicate with teachers via email or during online office hours to ask questions, explain extenuating circumstances, or get feedback.
 - Use feedback and check grades from their teachers on assignments, projects, assessments, and other work as required by teachers.
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- Participate in related arts, media, assigned student resource activities, class meetings, social-emotional learning, and more to remain engaged in school and with peers and teachers.
 - Have access to project materials, textbooks, online content, curriculum materials, etc.
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- Be able to participate in extracurricular activities and athletics (when available) following health and safety guidelines.
