Bailly/Liberty Elementary are Leader In Me Schools

This school year, both Liberty Elementary and Bailly Elementary Schools have embarked on an adventure called The Leader In Me (TLIM).

The goal of the Leader In Me is for students to understand that they all have the essential qualities to become leaders. The Leader In Me also helps to create a common language within a school by teaching students the Seven Habits. TLIM process is based on the work of Dr. Stephen Covey's book "The Seven Habits of Highly Effective People." The Leader In Me also helps to create a common language

The Leader in Me is a whole school transformation process. It teaches 21st century leadership and life skills to students and creates a culture of student empowerment based on the idea that every child can be a leader. To prepare for this adventure all staff members from Bailly and Liberty Elementary were invited to attend a three-day training at the beginning of August. Events were hosted at each of the school's during the three days.

Move Your Feet Fridays: Brummitt Walking School Bus

In an effort to provide students opportunities to get exercise and move toward lifelong fitness, students at Brummitt Elementary are going to try something new this year.

The idea is called the Walking School Bus and the concept is simple. Imagine a carpool without the car. Adult supervisors will walk through a neighborhood close to the school, pick up participating students along the way and collectively walk with them to the school.

The school has selected three consecutive Friday mornings for this fitness activity.

The first is Friday, Sept. 9 in the Wake Robin area, followed by the Graham Woods area on Sept. 16, and Duneland Cove on Sept. 23. In the Duneland Cove area, students will join the walking school bus as they work their way through the subdivision and will then board a regular school bus at the last stop in the area in order to get to school in a timely fashion.

"We hope to add a few dates in the spring if all goes well," said LouAnn Hopson, Brummitt's physical education teacher.
